5. If elected, what are your top three priorities for 2019-2020?

Answer: Supporting public school education for K12, Community College and 4 year college
Improving infrastructure particularly roads,
bridges, electric grid, and high speed internet

11. Currently, both the Department of Transportation and the Department of Public Safety have law enforcement officers that specialize in commercial vehicle enforcement. Do you believe Arizona should look at consolidating all truck enforcement activities under the Department of Public Safety?

Answer: Yes, I believe we should look at consolidating ADOT's law enforcement under the DPS.

Comments: <u>Let's not duplicate enforcement activities.</u>

12. Given the importance of transportation is to our economic success, how would you propose we solve the revenue shortfall needs for transportation?

Answer: I have proposed a one cent per year for five years gas tax increase starting in 2019. I believe your organization in 2011 supported a bigger increase. This is reasonable and the economy certainly can absorb the increase without significant difficulty based on the wide swings in gas prices in the last few years. Without some additional funding our roads infrastructure will continue to be a drag on our economy.
