5. If elected, what are your top three priorities for 2019-

Answer: Fully funding Public Education, Higher Education (Pima Community College & UA), ITED (restore 9th grade CTE program) Protect Medicaid Expansion and Kidscare at full funding Affordable Housing, Fully restoring funding for AZ Housing **Trust Fund**

6. Do you support the continued use of bona fide independent contractors in the trucking industry and oppose efforts by state and local governments to reclassify owner-operators as employees?

Comments: I would need to research this further to see if there is a breaking point for the additional expense of purchasing an alt-fuel vehicle, at which time they could then start paying into the use of roads.

11. Currently, both the Department of Transportation and the Department of Public Safety have law enforcement officers that specialize in commercial vehicle enforcement. Do you believe Arizona should look at consolidating all truck enforcement activities under the Department of Public Safety?

Answer: No. I do not believe we should consolidate ADOT's law enforcement under DPS.

Comments: I answer no because I would want to see who has more capacity and experience in this type of enforcement prior to making a decision.

12. Given the importance of transportation is to our economic success, how would you propose we solve the revenue shortfall needs for transportation?

Answer: We need to start by raising the gas tax as it is long overdue for reasons stated. We then have to look at other federal, state and local funds to determine other revenue and ensure that Southern Arizona specifically Pima County gets its fair share of funds for transportation.
